REPORT ON SKILL-BASED TRAINING AT SEITHOGEI LIVING SCHOOL

Organized by the Department of Sociology, Holy Cross College

Date: November 30, 2024

As part of our ongoing efforts to provide hands-on, practical learning opportunities, a total of 15 students from the 5th semester and 4 faculty from the Department of Sociology visited Seithogei Living School, Kohima for a skill-based training session on November 30, 2024. Seithogei Living School, founded on Tertiary Education and Lateral Thinking concepts, aspires to instill in the future generation the values of adaptability, resilience, and sustainability. With the slogan "Purity of Thought and Action," the school takes a comprehensive approach to developing future habitats for mankind, stressing bamboo architecture, integrated organic farming, creative arts, livelihood development, and environmental restoration.

During our visit, Mr. Richard Belho, an award-winning architect and social entrepreneur, who founded Seithogei Living School, was the key resource person. Mr. Belho is the creator of Zynorique Initiatives, an architecture practice in Kohima, Nagaland. He has received the Bamboo Pioneer Award from the World Bamboo Organisation, the Naturenomics Award from the Balipara Foundation, and the Young Designer Award from Indian Architect and Builders Magazine. The skill-based training included a wide range of related topics, including bamboo-based construction, permaculture & sustainable farming, vermicomposting, and holistic sustainability techniques. Vermicomposting using earthworms to break down organic matter was the first topic covered in the comprehensive skill-based training program. Practical lessons gave hands-on experience in employing the earthworm to transform trash into treasure, with multiple benefits including replenishing depleted soils, decreasing discarded discards, and ecological advantages. Next, the speaker discussed sustainable land management and ecological balance, where he highlighted that permaculture and sustainable farming can result in long-term ecological balance and the critical role that responsible farming plays in improving community well-being. In addition, bamboo architecture showcased eco-friendly construction practices using bamboo as a sustainable building material, accompanied by discussions on design considerations that minimize environmental impact without compromising durability and aesthetics. Lastly, the focus on holistic sustainability practices illuminated Seithogei Living School's broader vision, which includes organic farming, music, creative arts, and livelihood

initiatives with remote communities, underscoring how lateral thinking and innovative strategies can effectively address the complex social and environmental challenges of our time.

The training at Seithogei Living School demonstrated how responsible architectural planning and environmentally friendly agricultural practices can promote resilient communities by combining theory and practice. Participants not only witnessed these concepts in action, but also participated in hands-on activities emphasising the significance of environmental responsibility. The event enhanced students' awareness of sustainable living, allowing them to think critically and imaginatively about environmental solutions that benefit both society and nature.




