REPORT ON THE EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO NAGALAND

Date: December 1 - 3, 2024

The Department of Sociology organized an educational trip to Nagaland from December 1 to 3, 2024, with the primary goal of participating in the renowned Hornbill Festival at Kisama Heritage Village, Nagaland. 
